Pew Research Center studies reveal that Latino constituents are discouraged to get involved and address their concerns. This discouragement emerges from the inability to connect to a Latino leader in their communities. The inability to connect to officials that represent them isolates the Latino community from decision making processes. This isolation marginalizes the Latino com-

munity, restricting their leadership development potential leaving the community with no political representation on a local or statewide level. Consequently, for transparency in public management to exist, there has to be political and social harmony, which means that there must be business and corporate social responsibility. In Activists is where the hope of a more just society exists.

Arts, Theatre, Music, History



Dear Friends,

We would like to introduce you to our 2016 Newsletter which is full of newsworthy information and services that we provide to our community. This Newsletter was created for you in the hopes that you would read through it and find a program that would benefit you or someone you know in our community. Our philanthropic programs were created with our underserved youth in mind. Connecticut is second to Rhode Island with the highest statistics in unemployed youth between the ages of 16-29. According to *Connecticut Voices for Children* "closing Connecticut's opportunity gaps for young and minority workers will be necessary for the future economic health and quality of life in the state. Connecticut's Black and Hispanic workers face high unemployment and low wages. Among Connecticut's unemployed youth, one-third (33.6%) have been out of work for more than 26 weeks, above the national rate of 27.7 percent". We have come to realize that in order for our youth to move forward, we need to have programs that engage them in creative and innovative ways, but we also cannot neglect the fact that our youth need their parents to be involved as much as our community. We look forward to dialogue, partnerships, collaborations and engagement with you and our community. Get involved! Let's build together the future of our children.

Nos gustaría presentarles a nuestro boletín de 2016 que está lleno de interesante información y servicios que ofrecemos a nuestra comunidad. Nuestros programas filantrópicos fueron creados con nuestros jóvenes marginados en mente. Connecticut es el segundo estado después de Rhode Island con la estadística más alta en jóvenes desempleados entre 16 y 29 años de edad. Según, *Connecticut Voices for Children* "cerrar las brechas de oportunidad para jóvenes y trabajadores de minorías en Connecticut será necesario para la salud económica futura y la calidad de vida en el estado. En Connecticut negros e hispanos trabajadores encaran alto desempleo y bajos salarios. Entre los jóvenes desempleados de Connecticut, un tercio (33,6 por ciento) por encima de la tasa nacional de 27.7 por ciento han estado sin trabajo por más de 26 semanas". Hemos llegado a reconocer de que para nuestros jóvenes seguir adelante, necesitamos tener programas donde ellos participan en formas creativas e innovadoras, pero también no podemos descuidar el hecho de que nuestros jóvenes necesitan tanto sus padres como nuestra comunidad involucrados. Es con entusiasmo que deseamos crear diálogo, alianzas, colaboraciones y compromiso con usted y con nuestra comunidad. ¡Participa! Construyamos juntos el futuro de nuestros hijos.
